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High School Planning Chart

Subject	9th	10th	11th	12th
English writing literature, American, English, world, ancient, modern, etc. note: colleges require 4 years; it includes a combination of writing and literature				
Mathematics algebra 1 and 2 geometry precalculus and trigonometry calculus note: colleges require 3-4 years				
Social Sciences US history world history American government economics civics note: colleges require 3 years				
Science earth science biology chemistry physics note: colleges require 2-4, some should include a lab, this varies				
Foreign language note: colleges require 2 years of the same language; try to take one in the senior year				
Physical Education note: this requirement varies				
Fine Arts art music drama dance note: this requirement varies				
Electives such as Bible, computer, home economics, wood working, speech and debate etc.
